# Finding funding and collaborators

- Finding collaborators through the analysis of Scival publication data and finding partners for EU projects.

# Proposal writing, submission and post award management

- Write a fantastic research proposal through training initiatives such as the Grants Academy and EU Academic Development Scheme. We can help improve the quality of your submission through internal peer review and ensure the ethics of your proposal is sound as well as cost the proposal for you, record it on RED and submit it to the funder where relevant.
- Manage the post-award process by raising invoices, dealing with financial aspects and audits, sorting out contracts and offer letters and ensuring the smooth governance of your project. We also can help you with Research Data Management.
