OWRI seeks to establish a new and exciting vision for languages research in response to the challenges and opportunities presented by a globalised research environment and multi-lingual world. The initiative seeks to present a cogent, positive and compelling vision for the role of modern language expertise in opening up research opportunities drawing on other cultures, literatures and histories. Up to £4m Full Economic Cost (fEC) is available per OWRI programme over 4 years. Successful applicants will be funded at 80% of fEC.

		The research programmes will be multi-institutional and multi-disciplinary and demonstrate the strategic importance of language-based research and enhanced language expertise across the arts and humanities. Distinctively, the initiative will be research-led, with each OWRI programme focused around an ambitious and transformative language-based research endeavour, enhancing the UK's research capability in languages. The programmes will be expected to develop innovative ways of working and achieve wider impacts by engaging extensively with public audiences, policy bodies, private enterprises, the third sector and international partners. The Research Organisations involved in an OWRI programme will be required to demonstrate longer-term strategic commitment to the initiative, including the capacity to leverage additional funding resources.

		• Staff Mobility and Networking is available to support individual staff mobility and networking in the development of research, education and/or professional practice projects.
		The main Study Leave strand is not open for applications as the available budget was all allocated during the July 2014 application round. However exceptionally in 2014/15, applications for industrial staff secondments will be supported through the Staff Mobility and Networking strand.

		Statistical analysis shows that the least-advantaged students achieve lower rates of attainment and progression outcomes even after controlling for other influencing factors. We, the Higher Education Funding Council for England, wish to commission research that gathers together and critically reviews the available evidence on the causes of differential outcomes and the steps institutions are taking or could take to address them. We expect the findings of this research to inform consideration by Government and HEFCE about policy interventions - for example through the piloting and development of support for institutions to improve their students' outcomes - to address gaps between the achievements of different groups. 2. The research will: a. gather and collate existing evidence on causation and of practice, both in HE and in other educational spheres, and in England and other countries, with a view to identifying any gaps in knowledge and understanding b. develop a typology of causation, interventions and approaches c. critically review and evaluate this in order to identify the key considerations for future policy mechanisms with regard to HE in England, including the design and development of pilot activities and their subsequent evaluation. 3. We expect all elements of this work to be intrinsic to each other, and approached as such

		The standard route provides grants for projects with a full economic cost (fEC) between £50,000 and £1,000,000 for a varying duration up to a limit of 60 months.

		There is considerable flexibility when it comes to subject area, too. As long as you always make sure that your suggested topic falls within ESRC's remit, you are free to concentrate on any research area.

		Scope: The multidisciplinary and comparative research will focus on the emergence of a European cultural heritage in a historical perspective and the best way to transmit it. The content and methodology of education and curricula should be taken into account, as well as the role of new technologies and media. It will address how the local, regional, national and European aspects of cultural heritage are interlinked, how they are understood or not by citizens and encouraged or not by various stakeholders and promoters of cultural heritage. It will also analyse how this interplay of cultural heritage at different levels impacts on Europeanisation and the citizens' perceptions on Europe. The research will focus on the place of critical reflection in sustaining this as a cultural resource. This research should include both tangible and intangible cultural heritage as well as less established or popular examples of cultural heritage in the area of the living arts and consider contemporary trends in arts and culture in the shaping of tomorrow's European cultural heritage in order to enrich the study differentiating between commercial and noncommercial aspects. The research will also focus on the multilingual nature of the European heritage, seeking to gain a deeper understanding of the axiological, linguistic, social and cultural aspects of multilingualism and how they ensure the transmission of cultural heritage across generations and borders.

		to £30k to fund a discrete pilot project of 6 months duration. Further funds of up to £10k is available for placement activities
		within projects. Placements are designed to support post-doctoral, early or mid-career researchers who need to spend a period
		of time at a host institution (academic, third or public sector, industry) for the purposes of the research. Placements for Doctoral students will be considered, but applications can only be through their supervisor, who can apply on their behalf. Placements

		should be between 6 weeks and 3 months in duration.

		Are you an experienced researcher thinking about your next career move? Individual Fellowships fund researchers looking to enhance their career development and prospects by working abroad.
		Types of Individual Fellowships
		There are two types of Individual Fellowships:
		1. European Fellowships
		Held in the EU.
		Open to researchers either coming to Europe or moving within Europe.
		Can help to restart research careers after a break such as parental leave.
		Can also help reintegrate researchers coming back to Europe.
		2. Global Fellowships
		Fund secondments outside Europe for researchers based in the EU.
		There is a mandatory one-year return period.
		European and Global Fellowships can also include a secondment period of up to 3 or 6 months in another organisation in Europe, where this would boost the impact of the fellowship.
